About the Speakers:

Thomas S. Bodenheimer, MD, MPH Dr. Bodenheimer has been a primary care practitioner for many years. He has published extensively on primary care reform and healthcare reform in general. With his co - author Dr. Kevin Grumbach, he has published two highly influential books, *Improving Primary Care - Strategies and Tools for a Better Practice* and *Understanding Health Policy*. Dr. Bodenheimer received his MD from Harvard Medical School, completed his residency at UCSF Internal Medicine and his fellowship at San Francisco General Hospital, Community Medicine. His areas of interest include chronic illness care, patient - clinician interaction and primary care redesign.

Atul Gawande, MD As surgeon and a writer, Dr. Gawande is a staff member of Brigham and Women's Hospital, the Dana Farber Cancer Institute, and the New Yorker magazine. He received his B.A.S. from Stanford University, M.A. (in politics, philosophy and economics) from Oxford University, MD from Harvard Medical School, and M.P.H. from the Harvard School of Public Health. He served as a senior health policy advisor in the Clinton presidential campaign and White House from 1992 to 1993. Since 1998, he has been a staff writer for the New Yorker magazine. In 2003, he completed his surgical residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital, Boston, and joined the faculty as a general and endocrine surgeon.

Allan Goroll, MD Dr. Goroll, a general internist, is Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School and Physician, Medical Service, Massachusetts General Hospital. He graduated summa cum laude from Brandeis University and cum laude from Harvard Medical School. He is one of the modern pioneers in primary care, having initiated the nation's first residency track in primary care internal medicine at the Massachusetts General Hospital (where he served his residency), and lead - authored the first textbook of primary care internal medicine.
