Charles Huntington is the Associate Dean for Continuing and Community Education at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. He joined the UConn faculty in June 1996, as associate director of the Connecticut Area Health Education Center Program and assistant professor in the Department of Community Medicine and Healthcare. In 2001, he was also named program administrator for the University of Connecticut Health Center's *Connecticut Health* strategic initiative.

More recently, Mr. Huntington was appointed to the UConn Center for Public Health and Health Policy, and assumed the chair of the UConn Health Center's Course and Curriculum Evaluation Committee. He serves as the immediate past president of the Connecticut Public Health Association.

Prior to coming to Connecticut he spent ten years in Washington, DC, serving as director of government relations for the American Academy of Family Physicians. Mr. Huntington began his health care career as a physician assistant and practiced for eleven years in a rural underserved area of Upstate New York. He was an active member of the physician assistant profession and served as president of the American Academy of Physician Assistants in 1983-1984. He served as President of the National AHEC Organization in 2001-2002.

Mr. Huntington is a graduate of Williams College, completed his physician assistant training at the Wake Forest University School of Medicine. He earned a Masters in Public Health from the George Washington University, and was a Pew Health Policy Fellow at the University of Michigan School of Public Health.
