Margaret Flinter is the Vice President and Clinical Director of the Community Health Center, Inc., a statewide network of community health centers serving 70,000 patients across the state, and also serves as founder and director of its Weitzman Center for Innovation in Community Health and Primary Care. Margaret completed her Master's Degree from Yale University School of Nursing and is currently a candidate for the doctoral degree at the University of Connecticut.

From 2002 to 2005, Margaret was a Robert Wood Johnson Executive Nurse Fellow. In addition, she is the immediate past president of the Ct. Nurses Association. Margaret currently serves as the co-chair of the HealthFirst Connecticut Authority and the Statewide Primary Care Access Authority. Both of these committees are legislatively mandated to study and propose recommendations for achieving universal access to care and coverage that is consistent with the IOM principles.

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
